Four ways to continue to nurture a Sense of Responsibility

Foster a **Sense of Responsibility** by creating everyday opportunities for students to lead, reflect, connect and serve.



Student Voice

Establish platforms such as daily assemblies, Barazas, student councils, or storytelling exercises. Encourage students to lead discussions on topics that matter to them, building responsibility for both speaking and listening.

Service

Link classroom learning to local and global service projects. Whether fundraising, volunteering, or taking part in initiatives like RSIS, give students real opportunities to act for others.



Model Responsibility

Teachers and leaders should demonstrate responsibility in action: showing patience, listening actively, and admitting when they do not have all the answers. Students learn most powerfully from example.

Reflection

Use tools like the 3-2-1 Drill or postassembly feedback sessions to help students reflect on their experiences. Reflection ensures that responsibility becomes a habit, not just an event.



Discovering a Sense of Responsibility in Round Square schools

Responsibility lies at the heart of Round Square's Discovery framework. It is not something confined to classroom theory or set tasks, but an attitude, a commitment, and a way of living. Across Round Square schools worldwide, students and educators are finding creative and authentic ways to nurture a *Sense of Responsibility*—to themselves, to each other, and to the wider world.

So what does this look like in practice? Here are some stories from the RS Community:

<u>Sense of Responsibility in the Age of Al:</u> Kalyan Ali Balaven, Headteacher of the Dunn School in America, shares how his own teacher has shaped his view of responsibility.

Responsibility in Daily Practice: Seth Anandram Japipuria School Lucknow in India nurtures responsibility through their Daily Assemblies.

<u>Adult Leaders on RSIS Projects:</u> Past leaders on Round Square International Service Projects discuss modelling their own behaviour on a project openly to help support the students.

Round Square History Labs connect students across countries through the collaborative exploration of key historical topics, events, and figures. Each Lab invites students to analyse and share case study examples of the topic using a 360-degree approach - considering multiple perspectives, contested narratives, and an AI-generated overview of the topic.

This encourages students to engage with diverse viewpoints and develop a more nuanced understanding of key historical topics.

Students from Argentina, Colombia, India, Namibia and Oman joined together online for a session on 'Nine Planetary Boundaries: Only one Future for Earth". The call began with an

the students moved into breakout rooms for deep discussions.

Each group explored one of the pressing challenges shaping our planet's future, including ozone depletion, biochemical flows, land-system changes, freshwater change, biosphere integrity, ocean acidification, atmospheric aerosol loading, climate change, and novel entities.

The conversations sparked curiosity, creativity, and a strong sense of global responsibility. During the final plenary students shared initiatives and solutions, reminding everyone that although the challenges are complex, success relies on shared collaboration.

The Affiliated High School of Peking University's Dalton Academy in China – Theme: Festivals that Unite Us.

Students gathered for a session on "Festivals that Unite Us." The hosts opened with a conversation on what cultural heritage means, how it shapes who we are, and why it is vital to preserve it. Discussion in breakout rooms invited students to explore creative ways to make cultural heritage more appealing to younger generations—such as through themed video games or social media content.

When asked to share their main takeaways during the final plenary, students highlighted the importance of festivals as part of culture, along with the need to safeguard endangered languages. The dialogue emphasized the deep connection between tangible and intangible culture, reminding us that heritage preserves identity, strengthens community, and must be protected—especially as many festivals risk losing their relevance.
