We are delighted to invite Heads of Round Square Schools to save the dates for the next RS Heads' Symposium, which will take place in 15 months' time, from **20 to 24 January 2027**, in Hong Kong.

With grateful thanks to Frederick Poon and his team at St Paul's Coeducational College, you are invited to plan to **arrive in Hong Kong on Wednesday 20 January 2027** in time for a late afternoon/ early evening reception at our event hotel in Causeway Bay (tbc).

On **Thursday 21st** we will be coordinating visits to some Round Square Schools in Hong Kong. We will then meet over two full days (**Friday 22 and Saturday 23 Jan 2027**) for Keynotes, Baraza breakout discussions, and good practice sharing. On the middle evening there will be a dinner cruise.

On **Sunday 24th** for those who are able to stay on for an extra day, there will be an optional Geopark Island Hopping Tour, which St Paul's has secured for us with the Hong Kong Tourist Board. This will take us on a guided sightseeing tour to Hong Kong's UNESCO Global

We are currently working with St Paul's to confirm an accommodation option at a preferential rate in the hotel where our meetings will take place. Rates and hotel booking links will be shared in the coming months, along with a registration form.

The delegate fee EXCLUDING accommodation will be in the region of £650 per person.

Save the dates: 11-15 April 2027 - Oxford, UK -RS Coordinators' Assembly

We are excited to invite Round Square Coordinators/ RS Reps to hold the dates for the inaugural Round Square Coordinators' Global Assembly in 18 months' time, from **Sunday 11 April 2027 (arrival) through to Thursday 15 April 2027 (departure):** 4 nights/ 3 days.

The event will take place at Oxford University in the UK, during the University's Easter break. We will be staying in student accommodation at the University, with meals in Halls and social events in the colleges in the evenings.

Each day will feature a programme of good practice carousels, coaching/training, structured networking and collaboration incubation. We will be inviting you to tell us what you would like to see covered on the programme and will plan content, as far as possible,

The delegate fee INCLUDING accommodation is still tbc but likely to be £800 per person for single occupancy, and slightly less if you opt for twin. More information will follow. For now, please save the dates!

NB: With a RS Heads' Symposium and the RS Coordinators' Global Assembly both taking place in 2027, there will be no face-to-face Round Square Forums taking place in 2027. Instead there will be a supplementary online meeting, but, wherever possible, schools are encouraged to participate in the Symposium and Assembly events. RS Forums will return in 2028.



Encourage students to apply - RSIS Project in India December 2025

December 2025.

Round Square will be partnering with **Daly College**, to host a RSIS Project in Panna National Park, near the UNESCO World Heritage city of Khajuraho in Madhya Pradesh. This RSIS Project will see students working on construction of a community library and running a health/ eye camp, contributing to Daly College's long-standing partnership with local village communities.

Both the health and eye-care camps and women's hygiene drive will be led by qualified doctors who support the BAAVAN Trust, who have for many years worked with students from Daly College to meaningfully involve them in the processes of conducting medical appraisals of villagers and, in the case of the eye-care camp, prescribing spectacles.

As part of the experience, participants will be met on arrival at Delhi Airport by members of the Round Square Team, before travelling together through India as a group to the project site on the **Vande Bharat Express**, a comfortable, air-conditioned train. This extraordinary journey will provide a rare opportunity to see India's changing landscapes, whilst bonding as a team. In addition to the service components, whilst at the Project Site, students will have the opportunity to join two safari experiences in Panna Tiger reserve, and attend the famous Khajuraho temple light show.

Please share this opportunity widely with your students aged 16-18 and encourage them to apply to participate. **A RSIS Project Toolkit** for promotion with draft emails and posters is available to Round Square Coordinators via the website (login required).

Participants need to arrive into Delhi on 6 December 2026, and will be returned to the airport for departure flights booked on 18 December 2025.

The participation fee is £1,300.

A small number of **Discovery Bursaries** are available to students for whom financial circumstances would otherwise prevent participation. These cover the full project fee; participants are responsible for flights to and from India.

The session offered a wonderful space for students to reflect on what they love most about their schools and to celebrate what makes each of them unique. Amelie from Radford College, Australia, shared her pride in the school's strong commitment to service learning, with students coming together weekly to explore ways of giving back to the community. Amy spoke of the kindness and inclusivity she feels at Radford College, where everyone has a place no matter their background.

Students from The Emerald Heights International School in India described their breath-taking 100-acre campus with its medieval-inspired architecture, gardens, and spaces for everything from skating to tennis. The British School, New Delhi, India, highlighted its vibrant clubs and extracurriculars that inspire curiosity and growth beyond the classroom.

Meanwhile, students from Thomas More College in South Africa reflected on the importance of values, respect, and the warmth of a close-knit community, where small

Woodridge College and Preparatory School, South Africa – Theme: Is reading books still important or is it a thing of the past?

In our recent postcard, students from Germany, India, Pakistan, South Africa and UAE explored the question: Is reading books still important or is it a thing of the past? The discussion revealed that, while technology has changed the way we read, books—whether digital or printed—remain as important as ever.

After sharing ideas and perspectives in breakout rooms, students shared in the main room four powerful takeaways:

- Parents matter! Encouragement at home makes a huge difference in developing a love for reading.
- Reading is a superpower. It fuels creativity, imagination, and critical thinking.
- Stay tuned in: If you don't read, you miss out on what's happening in the world.
- Think big: A World Readathon could bring people together globally to celebrate and share the joy of reading.

The session ended with a clear message: books are not disappearing—they're evolving. And no matter the format, reading remains one of the most powerful tools for growth, knowledge, and connection.

GEMS New Millennium School, UAE – Theme: The Algorithm Economy. Who holds the power?

60 students from schools in India, UAE, Pakistan, and Canada joined the postcard to discuss the topic of the algorithm economy. The theme was focused on how algorithms are changing cultures and daily routines in big and small ways.

profits from the algorithm economy. Other groups discussed the digital divide, and how algorithms can make inequalities worse. Ideas were also shared about governance and regulation, with many agreeing that policies are needed to ensure fairness. Hearing perspectives from four countries showed how different societies view trust and responsibility in the digital space.

When asked what the main takeaway was for her as a leader, student Nandana Sajeev reflected: "We loved seeing the enthusiasm with which participants shared their ideas. The diversity of perspectives made the discussions rich and engaging. We are especially proud of how inclusive and respectful the conversations were in each baraza room". Cadet College, Pakistan, and Sunbeam Schools Lahartara, India - Theme: Civil rights movements and revolutions.

Thank you to Cadet College, Pakistan, and Sunbeam Schools Lahartara, India for hosting last weeks History Labs on Civil rights movements and revolutions.

In last week's sessions, over 100 students from 13 schools looked at different movements for rights and freedom from around the world. They heard about the conditions that lead people to rise up, the strategies they used, and the outcomes they achieved.

The discussions highlighted that progress can sometime take a long time or as easily be sparked by a pivotal moment. Either way, the impact of these movements was lasting and profound.

The delegates also explored the role that GPT's play in shaping peoples perspectives and how we should be aware of the potential risks and gains when using AI as a learning tool.
