Read the Team Blog: RS International Service Project - India December 2025

The team has arrived safely in Khajuraho, India, for this month's Round Square International Service Project with Daly College.

After a long journey, students quickly began forming friendships across countries, supported by warm hospitality on arrival and an excellent first meal together.

Their opening evening set the tone for the week: Baraza circles grounded in gratitude, ice-breakers that sparked collaboration, and the creation of four Baraza groups—GIRKA, Kuchanganya, Mana, and Factorial—each reflecting the spirit of connection, energy, and shared purpose.

With orientation complete and tools in hand, work on the construction site is now well underway. Students have explored the themes of adventure, responsible risk-taking, and stepping beyond comfort zones.

We are excited to invite students and staff to join us at Tiger Kloof Educational Institution next July for RSIS South Africa 2026.

Since 2015, Tiger Kloof has run a soup kitchen in the Huhudi settlement, just 10km from the campus, providing meals for children aged 3–6 years who are not enrolled in pre-schools

Over the years, students and staff from Tiger Kloof have expanded the project to include basic literacy and numeracy classes, held three times a week.

One of the biggest challenges is the lack of shade and protection from the wind. The goal of RSIS South Africa 2026 will be to build a structure that provides shelter and a safe space, enabling the soup kitchen to offer more structured learning opportunities for the children.

Your students can apply individually to join a RSIS Project, and do not need to be accompanied by a teacher. As part of the experience, they fly unaccompanied and are met at the airport by Round Square's Project Leadership Team. 

(Geography and English)

As the Round Square Geography Lab and English Lab series come to a close, we want to extend our heartfelt thanks to all the schools and students who hosted and participated.

This year's English Labs were hosted by The Millennium School (UAE) and Queen Anne's School (UK), while the Geography Lab sessions were led by Holy Trinity College (Argentina), Miles Bronson Residential School (India), Queen Anne's School (UK), The British School New Delhi (India), Paradis International School (Romania), The Hyderabad Public School (India), Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya (India), St. Andrew's School Turi (Kenya), Ashbury College (Canada), Vidya Devi Jindal School (India), Genesis Global School (India), and International Community School (Ghana).

Across the series of labs, 156 Baraza leaders guided discussions, facilitated activities, and modelled responsible, student-led leadership. Their efforts, alongside the engagement of 100 students from 12 schools in India, Pakistan, Kenya, Canada, and Colombia, created open, vibrant spaces for collaboration, dialogue, and intercultural learning.

Participants reported enhanced confidence in speaking English, stronger collaborative communication, improved intercultural awareness, and greater creativity and critical thinking. The Geography Lab alone reached 850 students across 43 schools in 14 countries, exploring themes including Population, Tourism, Sustainable Cities, Energy, and the Forces of Nature, with group tasks such as policy design and international collaborations further strengthening global competencies.

Edward Lea, Round Square Coordinator at St. Andrew's School, Turi, Kenya said:

"Geography Labs provide leadership opportunities to students who are sometimes overlooked in wider school life. The interpersonal skills required to collaborate with students from all over the world are brilliant to watch. In our particular case, it helped our school in the middle of nowhere in Kenya feel connected and part of something bigger."

Tourid. The impact of www on immigration

Students explored the impact of World War II on global migration, learning how millions were forced to flee conflict and persecution. In Argentina, they discovered how post-war immigration shaped the country's culture, economy, and society, as many arrived with little more than hope. Participants reflected on similar migration stories worldwide, noting how displaced populations redefined national identities.

The session concluded with a reminder to look beyond statistics and policies, recognizing the courage and resilience in every migrant's story. Guests were encouraged to be "the generation of empathy and kindness," honouring these experiences with understanding and humanity.

Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya in India. Theme: Beyond Academics: The Role of Emotional Health in Student Success.

Students from Canada, Colombia, and India came together to discuss the role of emotional health in academic success. They shared strategies for managing stress and anxiety, including organizing workloads, taking breaks, exercising, practicing mindfulness, talking with friends or teachers, and using creative outlets like music or journaling.

The session highlighted the power of student voice and global collaboration, with participants agreeing on the importance of advocating for emotional well-being in education.
